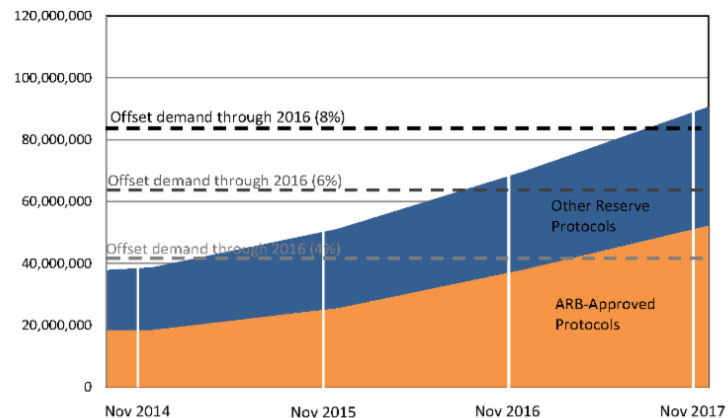

Projections of future supply of Climate Reserve Tonnes and Registry Offset Credits

The Reserve has released new projections for cumulative Climate Reserve Tonne (CRT) and Registry Offset Credit (ROC) supply through 2017, based on actual project data combined with assumptions about the rate and volume of future project registration and credit issuance. The release came on the heels of ARB Chairman Mary Nichols' statement that a decision on the Clean Harbors investigation would be announced in the very near future.

Applications to participate in Mexico ODS Project Protocol stakeholder workgroup due Friday, October 10

With support from the Instituto para la Protección Ambiental (IPA or

Institute for Environmental Protection) of the state of Nuevo León, Mexico, the Climate Action Reserve is adapting the Article 5 Ozone Depleting Substances (ODS) Project Protocol for use in Mexico. This effort will focus on developing a standardized project protocol for quantifying and certifying greenhouse gas (GHG) reductions from the destruction of ODS sourced from and destroyed in Mexico. The Reserve is forming a multi-stakeholder workgroup to support the development of the protocol. Interested stakeholders from industry, government, academia, consulting firms, verification bodies, and environmental advocacy organizations are encouraged to apply, particularly those based in Mexico or with extensive experience in Mexico. Applications are due by Friday, October 10, 2014.

New resources now available for Nitrogen Management Project Protocol

In 2013, the Packard Foundation awarded grant funding to the Climate Action Reserve to further develop the process by which the Reserve would continue to expand the Nitrogen Management Project Protocol (NMPP), as well as to explore the potential for a Version 2.0 expansion of the NMPP to irrigated corn crops in the southwestern U.S. The Reserve decided not to move forward with this specific protocol expansion to Version 2.0, but remains committed to expanding the protocol as new data and information become available to inform the process. To support future expansion of the protocol, the Reserve has recently developed and finalized the data information submittal process.

All of the resources to support data information submittals are now available online, as well as information concerning the scoping, data analysis, and decision not to move forward with the Version 2.0 expansion at this time.
