Greetings,


It was good to see many of you in San Francisco last week for the [Global Climate Action Summit](#), co-chaired by Governor Jerry Brown, Patricia Espinosa, and other key climate leaders. The event brought leaders and people together from around the world to "Take Ambition to the Next Level." It truly was a global platform to recognize the extraordinary achievements of states, regions, cities, companies, investors and citizens with respect to climate action and a strong, unwavering call to continue raising ambition in respect to climate action. The need to raise ambition was starkly evident from the scientific updates provided at the Summit - the world is virtually out of time to avoid dangerous human-induced impacts on our global climate system. Given these concerns, the Summit served as a launchpad for deeper worldwide commitments and accelerated action from countries and companies to prevent dangerous climate change, realize the historic Paris Agreement, and move beyond Paris to a low/no carbon economy.

The Climate Action Reserve was honored to support the week's premier carbon pricing event, [Carbon Pricing Delivering Climate Ambition](#). Carbon pricing was certainly a central topic last week, with people from many different perspectives sharing their views. At this event, senior government officials, business leaders, academics, international experts, and non-governmental organizations will come together to engage on key aspects of carbon pricing. The decarbonization of the global economy is in sight, but there is much work to be done. This was highlighted just a few weeks ago when the State of California released its [Fourth Climate Change Assessment](#), which details climate-related vulnerabilities throughout the state and provides planning tools for effective and integrated climate action and adaptation. The assessment paints an alarming picture for California's future - with severe heat waves, wildfires, and sea level rise projected to become even more devastating and deadly. The report underscores the urgent need for more extensive and expansive climate action now by all countries and companies.

We have much work to do, so let's raise our shared ambitions to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and protect our planet.

## La contribución de los mercados de carbono a las metas climáticas, económicas y ambientales de México

Desde antes que México se suscribiera a la Declaración de París sobre el precio al carbono en las Américas en 2017, la comunidad internacional del carbono ha tenido grandes expectativas por el lanzamiento de un Sistema de Comercio de Emisiones en México. A menos de un año después, y mientras que la administración de Andrés Manuel López Obrador se prepara para asumir el mando, SEMARNAT está trabajando en lanzar la fase piloto del Sistema de Comercio de Emisiones.

Mientras tanto, los mercados voluntarios de carbono están demostrando mecanismos exitosos para financiar el manejo sostenible de los recursos naturales y el manejo de residuos sólidos urbanos. Dos ejemplos de proyectos que usan los protocolos de la Reserva de Acción Climática son el relleno sanitario La Perseverancia, en Cuautla Morelos, que está capturando y destruyendo el metano que generan sus actividades, y la Ciudad de México que está desarrollando un proyecto para la mejora de la gestión forestal con el Ejido San Nicolás Totolapan.

Lo invitamos a que se sume a la conversación entre la Reserva de Acción Climática y nuestros ponentes para aprender más sobre el estado actual de la política de mercados de carbono en México y cómo los bonos de carbono están contribuyendo a las ambiciones climáticas, económicas y ambientales de México.

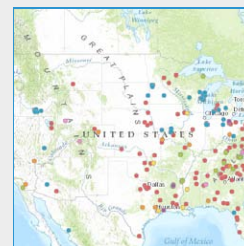
