President's letter

Greetings,

We head into 2024 with incredible progress in carbon markets. Efforts to guide the integrity, efficiency, and financial value of carbon markets have been established and will continue to progress and strengthen in the coming year. At COP28, the major carbon crediting programs, including the Reserve, announced a collaboration to promote scale and integrity in carbon markets to help operationalize Article 6 and Nationally Determined Contributions under the Paris Agreement. Specifically, the registries will seek to align common principles for quantification and accounting, jointly pursue measures that extend the durability of carbon stocks, strengthen transparency and social safeguards, enable financial flows to support mitigation and sustainable development in developing countries, and more.

Additionally, the world needs to differentiate fact from fiction in the global voluntary carbon market. While there are credits of questionable integrity in the market, the vast majority of credits from the premier registries are of high quality and sorely needed to address the climate crisis. Fortunately, the first CCP-labeled credits from the ICVCM are expected in 2024. Several carbon crediting programs, including the Reserve, applied for assessment against ICVCM's Core Carbon Principles (CCPs), which will provide a clear designation of high-quality credits to the market and help buyers invest in GHG reductions and removals

with confidence and without wariness of criticism.

Another effort to support the integrity of carbon credits is underway at the Commodity Futures Trading Commission (CFTC), which is developing guidance for <u>listing voluntary carbon credit derivative contracts</u> in order to advance transparency and liquidity, accurate pricing, and market integrity. Public comments on the proposed guidance are due by February 16. As noted in <u>Chairman Rostin Behnam's remarks at NACW 2023</u>, the CFTC plays an important role in ensuring carbon market integrity. The CFTC regulates derivatives, but also has a unique authority to regulate against fraud or manipulation in the underlying market because of the correlated price reference in the futures market.

Although great strides are being made, carbon markets still face challenges. While the messaging from COP28 affirmed that <u>carbon markets are essential</u> to mobilizing capital at scale to help countries achieve net-zero targets and help capital flow from the Global North to the Global South for climate objectives such as clean energy and forest protection, countries failed to agree on Article 6 guidance, delaying the global carbon market program. Market participants hope that the additional time countries take to reach an agreement will lead to a clearer and more manageable mechanism.

The conversation on the progress and future of carbon markets will continue at the North American Carbon World (NACW) conference, happening March 19-21 in San Francisco, California. For 21 years, NACW has been North America's premier event to learn, collaborate, and network on carbon markets and climate policy. 

Infographic: Reducing GHG emissions in adipic acid production in China

The China Adipic Acid Production Protocol addresses nitrous oxide (N2O) emission reductions at adipic acid production facilities in China. With N2O having a global warming potential 273 times that of CO2, the protocol
